NOTES

- Date is based on the January 4, 2022 database from the New York State Board of Elections.
- Allocation is based on LPNY Rules Article 6.3.2. Each Judicial District has 2 representatives plus 1 for every 600 active enrolled Libertarians and 1 for every 4,000 votes for the Libertarian Party candidate for Governor of New York in the last election.
- In order to get on the ballot, candidates need signatures from 5% of the enrolled Libertarians in their district.
- On April 11, 2022, the State Committee voted to lower the threshold from 5% to 1.5%.
